4. First-aid measures

Inhalation

Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Oxygen or artificial respiration if needed. Do not use mouth-to-mouth method if victim inhaled the substance. 5. Fire-fighting measures

6. Accidental release measures

Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

Emulsifies with water. Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk. Dike the spilled material, where this is possible. Siphon the majority of the liquid into drums for use or disposal, depending on the circumstances. Absorb in vermiculite, dry sand or earth and place into containers. Clean the area with common powdered household detergent and a stiff brush and just enough water to make a slurry.
